



Australian Curriculum: Languages Term 4, 2015 update

Hindi, Turkish and the Framework for Aboriginal Languages and Torres Strait Islander Languages

The Australian Curriculum: Languages for Hindi, Turkish and the Framework for Aboriginal Languages and Torres Strait Islander Languages has been approved by the ACARA Board and will go to the Education Council for endorsement in early December 2015.

The development of these curricula has received positive support from our stakeholders including community groups, schools and teachers.

Auslan and Classical Languages

ACARA is continuing the development for Classical Languages and Auslan (Australian Sign Language) by hosting workshops at its offices in Sydney.

A workshop with the Auslan curriculum development team was held 2–4 November 2015. The purpose of this workshop was to review the broad outline and further develop the sub-strands: *Socialising and Identity* and *Creating and Language Awareness*. The next workshop is scheduled for mid-February 2016.
