It is used in bilingual settings across the United States. As a framework for organizing instruction, The SIOP® Model supports teachers in planning and delivering high-quality instruction for all students. There are eight interrelated components in the Model:

- 1. Lesson preparation
- 2. Building background
- 3. Comprehensible input
- 4. Strategies
- 5. Interaction
- 6. Practice and Application
- 7. Lesson delivery
- 8. review and assessment
