### Babel update, posted 9 June 2017

#### Dear Members

The AFMLTA recently provided an update to all state and territory Presidents about the publication and distribution of the editions of BABEL magazine.

For your information, a census of memberships is conducted by the AFMLTA on the 31 May of every year. If you renewed or joined the MLTA ACT Inc. before the 31 May you are entitled to receive the editions of BABEL magazine for that calendar year. Each state and territory MLTA pays an annual capitation fee to the AFMLTA which is determined by the number and type of memberships as at 31 May every year. For the MLTA ACT Inc. our capitation fee to the AFMLTA is \$33 per member – this means that out of the \$70 standard membership fee and the \$40 student membership fee, the MLTA ACT Inc. pays \$33 to the AFMLTA per member. Most of this capitation fee goes towards the publication and distribution of the editions of the BABEL magazine.

As you may be aware there have been delays in receiving the 2016 editions of BABEL (Volumes 51.1, 51.2 and 51.3). I have been advised that Volume 51.1 was recently posted to all 2016 financial members. Volumes 51.2 and 51.3 are currently with ACER and will soon be posted directly to all financial members (Volume 51.2 by the end of June and Volume 51.3 soon after that). This means that if you were a financial

member in 2016 (renewed or joined prior to 31 May 2016) you will receive your Volume 51 editions of Babel magazines.

The AFMLTA has assured all MLTAs that the 2017 editions of BABEL magazine (Volume 52.1 and 52.2) are well in hand and are almost ready to be published and then distributed. They will be posted to the address provided by each 2017 member when they completed their 2017 membership form.
