Reminder regarding contacts with Embassies

Please remember the following instructions from Assistant Director of Universal Support, Meg Owens, regarding contacts with the French-speaking embassies:

Dear language teachers,

First and foremost I'd like to thank you for your hard work, and passion in the delivery of languages across our schools in the ACT. Your work is greatly appreciated and your active advocacy for your languages and communities does not go unnoticed.

It is very important to remember that as members of the Education Directorate, you are public servants and part of the ACT Government. This means that when you meet with external bodies, organisations and embassies, you are seen as such and a voice for the ACT Government rather than an individual from your language community. For this reason, regular clearance processes must apply if you are acting in any public capacity. Which includes conversations with embassies and external organisations. The process of approval includes approaching your principal for approval whilst simultaneously informing the Directorate.

The Directorate has a request in regard to your relationships with Embassies, International community and any non-Directorate organisations.

1. Embassies –

- It is very important to remember that an Embassy represents a foreign government body, and all discussions and agreements that are made can be considered to be between the ACT Government and that foreign government.
- If you are meeting with any Embassy, Embassy official, ambassador, or embassy staff you **must** inform the Directorate.
- The reason for this is that we must inform another area of the Directorate who monitor international stakeholder relations.
- It is also often important to have someone attend from Universal School Support to take note of any agreements or decisions made. No agreements or decisions can be made without Directorate approval.
- If you are planning to contact the Embassy related to your language to request support for language teaching assistants, prizes, funding or any other support, it is important to do this through the Directorate.
- If there is a member of an Embassy community visiting your school, you must also inform the Directorate.

2. External organisations -

- if you are presenting at public events, conferences, professional learning or other capacity about language provision or ACT Education matters, as a teacher from the Directorate, you will be seen as the face of the Directorate.
- You must obtain Directorate permission to speak at events; this includes clearance of materials and topics for speaking.

3. Any other agreements regarding teaching arrangements through external organisations for language network events, network meetings, language teaching assistants must come through the Directorate.

These arrangements are being put in place to ensure your safety and security, and in most instances there will be no issue at all. It is about ensuring that we are informed of all interactions in the language space, so that there are no double ups in information or agreements.
