

The initial focus should be on general language acquisition. Following this the focus should primarily be on developing Listening and Reading skills but also how to transfer meaning from Russian to English without necessarily being a strict form of translation. Interpreting and Writing activities should be used for language learning purposes but are not required as an outcome for the course.
