

# MLTA ACT Scholarship 2024 APPLICATION INFORMATION

# What is the MLTA ACT Scholarship?

This scholarship, originally known as the FIPLV Congress 1988 Scholarship, was established after the success of the 1988 FIPLV World Congress on language learning hosted by the MLTA ACT Inc. It provides financial assistance for teachers to further their professional development through travel and participation in educational programs or to develop a special language program. The scholarship is awarded up to twice each year, with a maximum amount of \$1,000 possible.

### Who can apply?

Each financial MLTA ACT Inc. member who:

- Is an active and contributing member of MLTA ACT Inc. for at least two years prior to applying.
- Intends to continue working as a language teacher.
- Will use the scholarship within twelve months of receipt.
- Will submit a report of their activity for publication in the CONTACT newsletter and/or present at an MLTA ACT Inc. event.

### How to apply?

Complete your application including the following information through this Google Form.

- Full name
- Current school
- Years as an MLTA ACT Inc. member
- Language teaching experience
- Contributions to teaching languages beyond your own school
- Details of the proposed activity (dates, costs, other assistance)
- How the proposal will benefit you, your school, and the ACT language teaching community
- Outline of previous overseas experience (if applying to go overseas)
- List of previous MLTA ACT Scholarships received.

#### How is the decision made?

A panel from the MLTA ACT Inc. Executive Committee will review applications. Successful applicants will be notified promptly. Funds will be reimbursed after submission of receipts and your CONTACT article and/or your presentation plan. The Executive Committee's decision is final and will not be subject to review.
