Postponement of MLTA AGM and of workshop with Gianfranco Conti, posted 16 March 2020

MLTAACT Executive Committee have agreed that the MLTAACT AGM scheduled for Thursday 26 March 2020 be postponed due to the COVID-19 situation and current advice from the health authorities and government. The new AGM date will be decided based on the evolving COVID-19 situation. As soon as we have a new date, you will be notified.



We also wish to advise that we have corresponded with Dr Gianfranco Conti about the upcoming professional learning event scheduled for Saturday 2 May 2020 and as a result of the 14 day self-imposed isolation period for all incoming international travellers by the Australian Government we are postponing the workshop. We are working with Gianfranco on a date for later in the year. When this has been finalised we will communicate this to you.

These decisions have been made to ensure we are acting consistently with the coordinated local and national response to the COVID-19 situation.
