Online briefing with ACARA on proposed changes to the Australian Curriculum for Languages, posted 2 June 2021

We have secured an online session with ACARA for the MLTA ACT membership. The purpose of the session is for ACARA to detail and provide information on the proposed changes to the Australian Curriculum for Languages.



Public consultation opened on 29 April and is open until 8 July. It is essential that the voice of as many languages teachers as possible is heard throughout this review process and we urge our membership to have their voices heard. The review has so far proposed revisions to the second language pathways for F-10 and Years 7-10 in Chinese, French, Italian and Japanese. The other Languages subjects and pathways will follow in stages and be completed by 2023. It is expected the review of the first four languages will provide a framework for the revision of the other languages curricula. So, it is essential that no matter which language you are teaching, that you provide feedback. You can see more on the ACARA website
